- Review & oversight
 - OIRA
 - No effective review & oversight

BCA: Then and Now

Executive Office of the President

- Early successes, followed by timidity and stasis
- Conflicting missions
 - OIRA works only when the president wants net benefits
- Persistent resource decline
 - Understaffed even in best days
- Rules of engagement
 - Unable to engage the public

Agencies

- Early resistance, followed by capture and corruption
- Consistent mission
 - BCA is a tool for advancing agencies' goals and objectives
